Nominating Committee: April announced a Nominating Committee will be created in January.

Garden Q & A: In response to a question whether it is too late to plant/move Canna and Amaryllis bulbs, April and Gale explained a shovel should be used to dig them up after the frost and before the ground hardens. Cut off the leaves and store them dry.

Regarding a question whether it is too late to separate mums, April replied that "yes" it is too late and Spring is the time to separate perennials.

A question was asked how to handle pots that have had diseased tomatoes and cucumbers. April responded the containers should be scrubbed first to get off mold with a brush, then the containers should be washed thoroughly with 1 part bleach to 10 parts water (bleach washing).

Another question was asked whether you can divide tulip bulbs now. April responded that you can still divide existing bulbs or plant new bulbs now as long as the weather is still warm enough and the ground is not frozen.

Perennials: April and Gale distributed a flyer on the 2018 Perennial Plant of the Year, "Allium Millenium". April stated the Allium blooms in July and August and can be purchased in pots.

She said our area is considered Zone 5a and to make sure when purchasing any perennials they will successfully exist in our area.

Other Gardening Information: April and Gale stated trees and shrubs can be watered until we experience a severe frost. Mulch should not be applied until the soil is frozen solid. April stated our lawns should be aerated in the Spring for best results.

Tip Of The Month: Beth Dermody demonstrated a Christmas decoration using a cleaned, clear soda pop bottle with the top and bottom removed. Purchase mini Christmas trees (Walmart has them) and insert them inside the bottle. A small mirror can be used for covering the bottom and decorate around with styrofoam beads for a snow effect. Place the bottle on top of a small votive candle stand for a great decoration for Christmas.
